

Brookhaven's Largest Park

Dear Friends & Neighbors:

This year the City of Brookhaven's park master plan process will shape our park's future look and projects. Currently the City is processing plans and studies affecting our green space. This is a great opportunity for our community to participate in park planning.

In 2015, Brookhaven hired Sustainable Water Planning & Engineering to complete a comprehensive basin study for the Murphey Candler Park lake and Nancy Creek watershed. This study will help identify sources of lake silt and debris as well as solutions for erosion and lake pollution. Lake dredging will be considered to maintain the MCP lake, the only public lake in Brookhaven.

Also, Brookhaven is conducting a pedestrian, bike and trails initiative being led by Pond & Company. The project's focus is to develop a map for future infrastructure and to prioritize cost effective projects.

By the end of 2015, Brookhaven will present a comprehensive park master plan. The firm Greenberg Farrow leads the plan effort and seeks public input through a series of public meetings currently taking place.

Finally, the MCPC is proud to announce the 2015 Duck Duck Goose 5K. This year's event will feature a community wide social event (aka Duck Duck Food Truck)

Murphey Candler Park History

Who Lived in the Caretaker's Home?

In 1962 Mel & Jo Farrell moved into Murphey Candler Park with three kids in tow, Gail, Sharon & Bud.

Mel was the Director of the DeKalb County Parks and Recreation Department for 20 years beginning in 1952. He was a civil engineer and recreation specialist who designed many of the county's swimming pools and tennis centers. Additionally, Mel planned the excavations and oversaw the creation of ball parks and soccer fields and secured the grants to buy places like Callenwolde.

while raising her family in the park. The three kids helped work the pool at Murphey Candler Park through the 1960's and 70's. Much of the woods that surrounded the family in 1962 gave way to single family homes that dominate much of the land around the park.

Around 1978, some years after Mel's retirement from DeKalb County Parks the Farrell family moved out of the Caretaker's Home. The Sea Scouts would be the next tenant. However, the Farrell family was the last family to reside in this home and now fondly recall the memories of growing up in the largest park in Brookhaven. Christmas by the fireplace inside this cozy cottage, summers swimming in the pool and fishing down by the lake, at their front door. Memories and history worth preserving.


Duck Duck Goose 5K

Murphey Candler Park— The Future

In the Fall of 2013, the Murphey Candler Park Conservancy created a survey to seek input from neighbors and regular park patrons. Our group wanted a more comprehensive understanding of the uses and issues regarding Murphey Candler Park. Via online survey and write-ins, 214 people responded. Most of the results were not surprising.

Addressing the health of the lake (including shore erosion and siltation) was at the top of the list. In addition, parking and traffic in and around the park ranked high on the list of things that need improvement. While it is true the park is very busy with many activities at certain times of the year, perhaps the most critical issue is the lack of safe pedestrian access to the existing parking in the park. From a pedestrian safety standpoint, we believe it is a priority to address this safety item in the immediate future. Also ranking high from the survey results, was a first class playground that maintains the shaded forest feel. The MCPC will advocate for an innovative analysis and design process which should take place prior to any new playgrounds in the park.

Historic preservation and sustainability are important to the MCPC and residents alike. In 1959, the caretaker's home was the first structure placed in the newly established park. Originally this historic home, dating back to the turn of the last century, was built on a parcel of land that is now home to Brookhaven's Cherokee Plaza on Peachtree Road. In an act of historic preservation, the proposal of removal of two 1978 additions and restoration of the main structure has been put forth. The MCPC and Brookhaven have developed a caretaker's home restoration and park

conceptual plan with an architect. The goal is to develop a multi-use community use structure with room for meetings and possibly a coffee shop or boutique restaurant at some point in the future similar to the photo above in Minnihaha Park in Minneapolis, MN.

Other items that were noted as needing attention in our survey results were trail maintenance & new trails; park wide design standards for structures, signage, park elements, and site improvements; exotic invasive and nuisance plant species removal and revegetation with native plant material; a new pool house with entertaining space for larger neighborhood meetings.

Parks Update from the City of Brookhaven

The City of Brookhaven has recently contracted with Sustainable Water

Planning & Engineering to develop a Watershed Plan for the Murphey Candler – Nancy Creek watershed. This study will assist the city in securing grant funds for projects, programs and policies that are identified in the plan to improve watershed health and minimize flooding.

Engineers are currently walking along the streams and looking at bodies of water throughout the watershed to gather information and identify problems and solutions. When the walks are completed, the engineers will have walked eight miles of streams.

The first stakeholder meetings, centered on Murphey Candler Lake, were held over the summer. Public input meetings are currently underway, with the next one held on September 9th at the Lynwood Park Community Center from 7 - 9:00 p.m.

Additionally, a Facebook page, "Murphey Candler – Nancy Creek Watershed Study" has been launched where residents can post old and new photos of the watershed as well as provide input.

Regarding the parks master plan, The City of Brookhaven recently selected Greenberg Farrow for the development of Master Park plans of all parks in Brookhaven, including Murphey Candler Park. The consultants have begun their community outreach efforts, as the work will take place over the next few months with final master plans expected before the end of the year.

WEST NILE VIRUS ALERT:

The DeKalb County Board of Health saw an increase in West Nile virus activity in the county in late August. As part of the Division of Environmental Health's routine monitoring, the number of infected mosquito collections increased from 37 during the week of Aug. 16 to 70 during the week of Aug. 23. In addition, the county reports two human cases of West Nile virus.

Effective repellents for use on skin and clothing contain DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus or IR3535. Clothing can be sprayed with permethrin, which will retain its effectiveness after repeated washing. Any repellent should be applied according to label instructions. Please take precaution when you are outside anywhere including all of Brookhaven's Parks.


